

LABOUR MARKET BRIEF

■ ATLANTIC REGION



- Employment expanded at a moderate pace in the month, up 1.0% on an annualized basis.
- Part-time jobs increased while full-time jobs declined.
- The unemployment rate moved higher in the month to 5.7%, reaching its highest point since January 2022.
- The goods-producing sector added jobs (+7,500), while the services-producing sector saw growth of 10,000 jobs.

ATLANTIC CANADA -

- Employment grew at a strong pace in October, up from the prior month by 9,900 jobs, making it the fifth consecutive monthly gain.
- The growth occurred in both full-time and part-time positions, though primarily part-time.
- The unemployment rate fell in the month to 7.3%, influenced by the solid job gains.
- The goods-producing sector added jobs (+2,600), while the services-producing sector saw growth of 7,500 jobs.



Did You Know...

Employment in the information, culture, and recreation industry surged past prepandemic levels during summer 2023 to reach an all-time high of 47,200 in October. This growth represents a major improvement for the industry, which did not begin to recover from pandemic containment measures until early 2022. The recent job gains occurred mainly in Nova Scotia (+5,300 year-over-year), which now accounts for half of the Atlantic Region's employment in the sector, as well as in New Brunswick (+2,800).
