

### LABOUR MARKET BRIEF






- ♠ Employment rose during the month by 46,700 jobs.
- Full-time jobs increased alongside fewer part-time.
- The unemployment rate declined slightly in September to 6.5%.
- The goods-producing sector lost jobs in September (-3,600), while the services-producing sector saw growth of 50,200 jobs.


#### ATLANTIC CANADA -

- The Atlantic Region experienced a reduction in employment in the month, shedding 100 jobs.
- Full-time jobs increased alongside fewer part-time.
- The unemployment rate fell in the month to 7.3%.
- The goods-producing sector lost jobs in September (-300), while the services-producing sector saw growth of 300 jobs.



# Did You Know...

Employment in the information,
culture and recreation industry went
down by 2,900 year-over-year (-6.7%),
with declines occurring to varying
degrees in all four Atlantic
provinces. This represents a major
shift from strong growth observed
during 2022 and 2023 as the sector
mounted a delayed recovery from
pandemic job loss. In recent years the
industry has been affected by labour
supply challenges and the recovery of
tourist visitation.
