

### LABOUR MARKET BRIEF

### **■ ATLANTIC REGION**




- Employment grew at a strong pace in December, up from the prior month by 90,900 jobs, making it the fifth consecutive monthly gain.
- ▶ The growth occurred in both full-time and part-time positions.
- ★ The unemployment rate declined slightly in December to 6.7%, influenced by the solid job gains.
- The goods-producing sector added jobs (+22,500), while the services-producing sector saw growth of 68,400 jobs.


### ATLANTIC CANADA -

- Employment grew at a strong pace in December, up from the prior month by 7,000 jobs.
- Full-time jobs increased alongside fewer part-time.
- The unemployment rate moved higher in the month to 7.8%, reaching its highest point since August 2022.
- The goods-producing sector added jobs (+1,000), while the services-producing sector saw growth of 6,100 jobs.

# Did You Know...

Employment in the construction industry declined by 1,700 in December from a record high of 107,800 in November but remains elevated by historical standards. On average, employment in the industry was 7.7% higher in 2024 than in 2023. Even as population growth slows, the industry is working to clear a backlog of demand for dwellings: there were 4,737 housing starts in Q3 2024, the highest level in 37 years.
